<p>2. Meditation — Key to fully acquiring the verse and allowing it to renew our minds is to meditate on the verse. You do that by dwelling on the verse in your mind and in your heart.</p> <p>A. Word by word examination. Look at every word in the verse and ask yourself, "Why did God place that word there?"</p> <p>B. Ask questions—who, what, when, where, why, and how about the verse. Barrage the verse with questions.</p> <p>C. Look at the context of the verse.</p> <p>D. Paraphrase verse in order to fully grasp its meaning.</p> <p>E.
